Request for Proposals
Train Up and Hire Up Support Services:
Behavioral Health Services for Baltimore City Residents in the COVID-19 Economic Recovery

The Mayor's Office of Employment Development seeks responses to a Request for Proposals (RFP) to provide behavioral health services as a support service to participants in employment development programs. This initiative is one part of Baltimore's Economic Recovery plan. Once awarded, subgrantees will be expected to provide individual and group behavioral health services to residents negatively impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic who are participating in programs provided or coordinated by the Mayor's Office of Employment Development. These programs include Train Up, which provides occupational skills training, and Hire Up, which provides subsidized employment. The RFP was released on February 17, 2022, and can be viewed on the website of the Mayor's Office of Employment Development at moed.oedworks.gov.
